Explanation of the Capstone Presentation
<p>As you enter your senior year at NUAMES, each of you is at a different place in your personal growth and education. Whether you are attending university classes exclusively, NUAMES classes exclusively, or a unique mix of coursework, you all are working towards graduation. We acknowledge, therefore, that each of you brings a unique set of previous skills, knowledge and insight into your senior year.</p> <p>After choosing your project, you are asked to EXPLORE your choice, EXTEND your knowledge or skills in that area of interest, and EXPRESS what you learned in the process.</p> <p>You will have two options for presenting your capstone. 1) A five minute presentation in front of your mentor and guests. 2) A table display complete with a story board and artifacts as you present your project and answer guest's questions.</p>

Additional Instructions for Presentations
This must be a multimedia presentation i.e., PowerPoint, Prezi, presentation board, etc.
- The presentation should be 5 to 7 minutes long including set-up.
- It should contain the following components: portfolio on display, multimedia presentation and artifacts (if applicable).
- Students should rehearse their presentation with their mentor before the capstone night.

Presentation Checklist	
	Within the multimedia presentation, students will:
	- Introduce themselves and their mentor
	- Introduce the Capstone project (i.e. What is the project? Why did you choose it?)
	- Describe the steps they took to complete the project
	- Describe how they EXPLORED the chosen area of interest
	- Describe how they EXTENDED their knowledge/skills in the area of interest
	- Display artifacts related to the capstone project
	- Demonstrate professionalism in presentation and attire (as if preparing for a critical job interview)
	- Be well prepared and speak clearly and audibly
