- Obey all traffic laws
- Hill parking (uphill & down)
- 90 & 45 degree parking
- Parallel parking
- U-turns
- 3-point turn
- Lane change

How do I get my driver's license?

1. Get your Learner Permit
2. Pass Driver's Education
3. Drive with an instructor (6 hours driving & 6 hours observing)
4. Pass the Road Test
5. Complete 40 practice hours with a parent/guardian.
6. Pass the Traffic Safety & Trends exam.



How to get your license in 6 steps!

1

Learner Permit

- Get your permit at age 15
- Must have permit for 6 months before you can get your driver's license
- **MUST** have learner permit before registering for class

2

Pass Driver Education

Classes are offered online (throughout the year) and during the school day (semester 1 and 2).

3

Driving with an Instructor

- You must complete 6 hours of driving and 6 hours of observing, with a NUAMES driving instructor
- Your driving instructor will contact you to schedule the driving portion
- Students will be scheduled to drive according to birthdate

4

Road Test

The road test will be given during the 6 hours you spend driving with an instructor. You will have 2 opportunities to pass the road test.

5

Practice Hours

- Before you can get your driver's license, you must complete 40 hours of driving with a parent/guardian
- At least 10 of the 40 hours must be at night

6

Traffic Safety & Trends Exam

Pass the Traffic Safety and Trends Exam. This test can be taken online & must be passed with 100% before you can get your license. You can access the exam at <https://secure.utah.gov/dlexams/>



Important Dates:

Class: Summer (Begins June 1, 2020)

- ◆ 30 hour course
- ◆ Go at your own pace
- ◆ Must complete all coursework & the final exam before August 19

Final exam dates & times:

Frequently Asked Questions

Question

How can I prepare for the Learner Permit test?

Answer

All information for the Learner Permit test can be found in the Utah State Handbook. You can get a handbook at the Driver License Division.

Question

Do I need to have insurance while driving with my Learner Permit?

Answer

Each insurance company has their own policy when it comes to teenagers driving with their Learner Permit. Contact your insurance company before getting your Learner Permit.

Question

Can I have other people in the vehicle while I am getting my 40 practice hours?

Answer

Yes, you can have immediate family members in the vehicle as long as a parent or guardian is sitting in the passenger seat.

Question

Are there any restrictions once I get my license?

Answer

Yes. You must have your license for 6 months before you can drive with other teenagers in the car. Also, you can't drive between the hours of 12:00 A.M.-5:00 A.M.

Question

Will I receive high school credit for passing Online Driver Education?

Answer

Yes, you will receive .25 elective credit. This will be posted on your transcript in the Fall.
